It is a simple style of art needlework that consists of embroidering the outline of designs onto a white or off-white background with a contrasting color of thread. Registration is required and participants who successfully complete the class will receive a two-year certification through the American Red Cross.

At least one adult from every troop is required to have this training. Cadette (8th grade), Senior, and Ambassador girls are welcome to register as part of earning their First Aid badge. Troop funds may be used to satisfy this requirement.

Registration closes 2 weeks prior to training date to allow you time to complete the online components.

Camp Adahi • April 27

High Award Prep

Bronze Award Training

Chattanooga • April 30

Gold Award interviews are a required step in the Gold Award process. Girls will complete both a proposal and a final interview as part of the process, and each interview date has openings for both types of interviews. Registration is required.

You will need to complete your paperwork on GoGold. All paperwork MUST be submitted via GoGold at least one week before the interview
