School Visibility

Be loud and proud! Let your school know Girl Scouts are here!

Choose two of the following activities:

- 1. Put up a bulletin board display in your school showing your troop's activities using pictures, event fliers, patches, etc. The display should be up at least one month, if possible.
- 2. Do a flag ceremony during morning assembly or a similar school event. Girls should be in their Girl Scout uniforms or Girl Scout t-shirts.
- 3. Do something special for the teachers, principal, or parent organization to show appreciation for what they do.
- 4. Put an article about Girl Scouts in your school newsletter or talk about Girl Scouts during the morning announcements.
- 5. Invite a teacher to help with a Girl Scout activity or badge workshop.

Service to the School

Give back! Help make your school a better place.

Choose one of the following activities:

- 1. Volunteer as a troop to help with a special project at school.
- 2. With your school's permission, plant flowers in a vacant spot on the school grounds.
- 3. With your school's permission, paint trashcans in colorful patterns.
- 4. Assist the parent organization with one of their meetings by doing a flag ceremony, handing out printed materials, providing snacks, etc.

Make New Friends

Widen your circle! Extend friendship to people at your school.

Choose one of the following activities:

- 1. Invite a non-Girl Scout friend to attend a troop meeting or service unit event as your guest.
- 2. Volunteer to organize rainy day activities or games during recess.
